



Recipe: Gluten Free Ginger Molasses Lookies

These cookies are perfectly chewy with just the right amount of sweet and holiday spice.
And, the easiest!

Ingredients

- 1 cup almond flour
- 1/2 cup quinoa flour (or garbanzo bean flour or coconut flour — but the best texture is with quinoa flour if you can get it)
- 2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 tablespoons molasses
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup coconut sugar
- 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar or extra coconut sugar to roll cookies in

Preparation

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 and line a baking sheet with parchment pa per.
- 2. Mix batter together and place in fridge for 10 minutes first.
- 3. Then roll into small 1/2 inch balls, roll in brown sugar and gently flat ten with your fingers.
- 4. Bake for 12-15 minutes until golden brown.

CRAFT: PINECONE WINTER OWLS CRAFT

Supplies

- Pinecones*
- White and beige felt and a tiny bit of orange too
- Cotton balls / Cotton
- Googly eyes
- Glue
- Scissors

*If you gathered the pinceones in the nature (I gathered some and got some from the store) do give them time to dry or dry them in the oven.



STEP 1: Once your pinecones are ready to go, start tearing up the cotton balls and stuffing them in the pinecone. You don't have to use glue as cotton balls will stay just where they are. Work your way around the pinecones – this will give them the "owl feather like" texture.

STEP 2: Make the owl "accessories" out of felt, cut out a pair of wings out of white felt (or any other color you want really). Next cut a small oval shape for the head from beige felt, also cutting a little bit smaller oval shape from the white felt. You can make one side of the white shape a bit heart like to give it a more "facial" look. Cut a small orange beak.

STEP 3: I glued the beak on top of the beige oval shape and glued the smaller oval shape on top of that. Next in line are googly eyes which stick nicely onto felt.


We used white school glue to stick on the wings and head details and it worked out nicely, although I think a glue gun would do an even better job.
